#### 3. Review basis of public forum

A public forum is an opportunity for citizen engagement and participation. We will invite the community to participate in community visioning exercises similar to those OCPC has completed.

Accordingly, a sample agenda would include: why do a CompPlan; a SWOT analysis; a quality of life assessment; issue identification; needs assessment; project development and identification; strategic planning; and visioning.

Supporting materials and information to display include: maps; photos; demographic information; and the community survey.

- o Preferably a location with circular tables and few distractions
- Engage in deep listening
  - o Provide sticky notes for anonymous comments
